Congratulations to David Morris and Nicholas O' Halloran, who attended the **TY Physics Experience** in Trinity College Dublin.

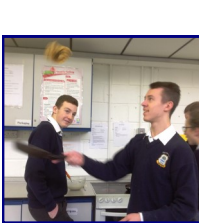
**BT Young Scientist**
